

CHED cites UC project as region's best community extension program; joins nation's top 15 awardees

The Commission on Higher Education in the Cordilleras (CHED-CAR) has selected UC's Project H.E.L.E.N. as the best university community extension program in the region, propelling UC into the nation's top 15 university extension projects.

In a December 17 metro Manila awards ceremony, CHED Chair Emmanuel Y. Angeles, House Committee Science & Technology Chair Joseph E. A. Abaya & other CHED commissioners awarded UC with a gleaming CHED trophy and a check for P300,000.00. UC was joined at the awards program by CHED-CAR CEO-VI Director-IV Freddie T. Bernal & CHED-CAR education supervisor Dr. Ramon D. Santiago.

In a keynote speech to the national awards program, Ched Chair Emmanuel Y. Angeles announced the doubling from P10.0M to P20.0M of CHED's budgetary allotment for the CHED awards; boosting the tangible rewards for the country's outstanding university performance in research and extension programs.

Project H.E.L.E.N., --- for Health, Education, Livelihood, Environment & Nurturance – stands for the five components of UC's community outreach / extension program. Project H.E.L.E.N., named after UC co-founder, Evangelina D. Salvoosa, --- is UC's vehicle to deliver meaningful impact programs that significantly improve the quality of life of targeted sectors in its home region.

'Balik-Iskwela' project: tutorial, material assistance & motivation for out-of-school youth - to prepare & pass the government PEPT or A & E test; 'UC Operation Alalay for out-of-school youth' (direct support to 'balik-iskwela' aspirants from application, transportation, merienda, tutorial class attendance up to the government examination day).

'Livelihood Alternatives' education project to wean parents away from exploiting children to work in the streets for commercial purposes. A UC-Save Our Street Children Foundation Inc. partnership, implementing the strategies of SOS-CFI executive director Hoover Agyao.

A UC-Municipality of Tublay 'Full Spectrum program' for assistance along the following components :

- (1) Formulate municipal organic agricultural plan, including a weekly organic vegetable market day (every Thursday at the UC parking area at Gov Pack road.) Beneficiaries : 15 to 20 members of ATOP (the Association of Tublay Organic Practitioners); with a gross profit of P29,000.00 since the 'informal' uc market opened on 29 October 2008.
- (2) Formulate with the local tourism council a plan, specifically producing video, print media brochures & presentations to develop the tourism potential of the area's Bengaongao & Paterno caves. Public viewing of all the multi-media, a-v promotional material prepared by the UC-Tublay local tourism team was launched on 17 November 2008.
- (3) Formulate solid waste management to control household waste, agricultural waste & small scale mining venture waste.
- (4) Pinpoint sources of pollution in the community's water resources (still on the drawing board, pending public authorization 'go-signal' --- a private-public sector recommendation on a long-range municipal water resources utilization & distribution plan.)
- (5) Training of Tublay day care & preschool practitioners.
- (6) A UC-Tublay Sangunian Kabataan project to conduct sports clinics.
- (7) Basic bookkeeping & financial management services administered to the Tublay Senior Citizen's Rice Retailing Association.
