Lady Jaguar Jomalyn Lopez won best server of the tournament while teammate Diane De Lara was adjudged as the tourney's premier libero. The rest of the team is composed of Jermie Cayat, Cathy Tandingan, Clarissa Tolentino, Janet Doria, Juliean Ramos, Michel Remo, Cindy Benitez, Olivia Joyce Salomon, and Jhiesel Agudia. They are handled by Coach Yul Benosa.

Meanwhile, the UC Men's Volleyball team conducted a volleyball clinic at Saint Mary's School of Sagada, Mt. Province (SMSS) from May 9 to 21 as part of UC's growing sports community program. SMSS principal Dennis Faustino and UC coach Yul Benosa made the volleyball clinic possible with a verbal agreement on behalf of the two institutions. Meanwhile, the story was much the same for the UC badminton team in the 2nd JVC Regional Circuit held at the Excel Badminton Court, San Fernando Pampanga on April 17-21 where they took home three top three finishes.
