UC number one in passing rate for the 21st consecutive exam 90% passing rate; 91 of 101 examinees

UNPRECEDENTED, UNSURPASSED AND UNMATCHED is this feat that makes other Higher Educational Institutions in the country look up to the University of the Cordilleras after being recognized as the nation's number one in Criminology licensure examinations for the 21st consecutive time. With 91 out of 101 of its examinees emerging victorious, UC yielded a passing rate of 91%, way over the national passing rate of only 35.20% in the exams held last May 5, 6 and 7 this year.

Five UC gradu-ates also made it to the Five UC top ten. Darwin Cabot Porin, Laurence Casil Lagmay, Javier For-ayang Gumiyao, Ber-nardo Badiwes Osting and Juliet Gasatan Kaniteng garnered 6th, 7th, 8th, 9th and 10th place, respective-ly. Kaniteng, who will be graduating Magna Cum Laude on May 18,2007, also placed 11th in the 2006 NA-POLCOM exams.

Dr. Benjamin Mang-usan, Dean of the College of Criminal Justice Education said that apart from being number one, UC Criminology examinees have been consistently improving their per-centage passing rate and the college hopes to beat their own record of an all-time high 98% passing rate set in March 2002. But passing the licensure examina-tion is not the and

recensure examina-tion is not the end all and be all of UC's Criminology educa-tion. "We produce graduates we produce graduates who have the knowledge

skills in addressing the problem of crimi-nality in the country and the country and the competence to meet the challenge of globalization in the field of Criminology", the dean said. "We obliged our-

selves to provide the community with pro-fessionally competent and morally upright graduates who can graduates who can deliver efficient and effective services in prevention, crime crime detection and investigation, law en-forcement, and custody and rehabilitation of offenders" added Dr. Mang-usan, who also sits as the Co-Chair for the Commis-sion on Higher Education's technical Panel Criminal Justice Education.

UC College of Criminal Justice Edu-cation (UC-CCJE) has become a buzz word, become a buzz word, reverberating among all other schools of-fering Criminology. Things are looking even brighter for UC CCJE now that it has earned the honor of

being the first and only institution to apply for the offering of Master of Science in Crimi-nal Justice Education with Specialization in Criminology. The UC

College Justice Criminal Education produced its first batch of successful examinees in the Licensure Examination in 1990 led by rent dean, Dr. Mang-usan and his team of competent and com-mitted practicing and full time professors. Since then, graduates of the College manage to take the form ton or to take the top ten or top twenty places in the board examination. It has then con-sistently topped the board examinations with a passing percentage way above the national passing rate.
