UC BCF College of Criminal Justice Education

*For the 19th time, UC Passing rate is # 1*

*Passing rates ranging from 98% to 87% since 1996 is unprecedented.*

For the 19th consecutive exam and counting, the University of the Cordilleras College of Criminal Justice Education continued its astonishing streak of posting the highest passing rates in the country at the Criminology Licensure Examinations.

Bannered by second place finishers Amado III Pepi Aquino, and June Carpio Diwag (87.20), the esteemed 60-year-old university saw 68 of its 78 examinees pass the licensure exam conducted by the Professional Regulation Commission for an 87.2% passing rate. Warren Ignas Abansi (84.70) finished 9th while Roderick Comargo Macararanga (84) finished 20th.

Sustaining passing rates of 87% to 98%, UC remained undisputed as the top Criminal Justice Education school in the country.

"To be Number One in the nation, nineteen (19) straight times, is unmatched, unsurpassed & unprecedented," said Jesus Benjamin Salvosa, UC Chairman, pointing to the exceptional track record amassed by UC Dean Benjamin Mang-usan & the UC CJE faculty Team. "One of these days, perhaps, another school may attain the number one spot, but the record of nineteen (19) consecutive exams as the number one school in the nation may never be matched," said the UC CEO. "Exceeding standards appears to be the S.O.P. of the UC College of Criminal Justice Education under the leadership of Dean Mang-usan," added Mr. Salvosa.

In recognition of his distinguished track record, Dr. Mang-usan was appointed by CHED as a member of its Technical Panel for CJE courses.

A total of sixty-eight (68) examinees from the University of the Cordilleras College of Criminal Justice Education passed the Criminology Licensure Examination given by PRC in eleven (11) venues throughout the country.

Professional Identification Card (ID) and Certificate of Registration will start on Monday, May 22, but not later than Monday, June 19.

The oath-taking ceremony of the examinees will be held before the Board on Tuesday, June 27, at 1 p.m. at the Fiesta Pavilion of the Manila Hotel.

Registration for membership with The Professional Criminologists Association of the Philippines (PCAP) will start on Monday, May 22.

The top performing schools in the May 2006 Criminologist Licensure Examination are Cagayan Colleges Tuguegarao, 62 of 202 examinees, 31 percent; University of the Cordilleras (Baguio Colleges Foundation), 68 of 78, 87 percent; University of Baguio, 60 of 92, 65 percent; Negros Oriental State University (CVPC)-Dumaguete, 32 of 59, 54 percent; Mountain Province State Polytechnic College-Bontoc, 45 of 93, 48 percent; and University of Manila, 20 of 58, 34 percent.

With 20 to 50 examinees, the top performing schools are City College of Manila, 26 of 30, 87 percent; St. Joseph Institute of Technology, 19 of 36, 53 percent; Ramon Magsaysay Memorial Colleges, 17 of 33, 52 percent; Wesleyan University of the Philippines, 14 of 28, 50 percent; and Holy Trinity College of General Santos City, 12 of 25, 48 percent.
