Our Founders invested all their assets in Baguio Colleges Inc., when it was established in 1946. They never took out the original capital, nor any of the earnings of the original investment.

In 1967, our Founders went beyond "leaving the capital and its earnings." Acting on their conviction that educating the youth of the land is a noble privilege, over and above that of proprietary interests, they decided to reorganize Baguio Colleges Incorporated, forming in its place, a foundation. They then donated all their corporate and personal assets to the Baguio Colleges Foundation, the entity which has evolved into the University of the Cordilleras of today.

UC therefore is a school that "gives it all back."

Nothing Taken Out; Every Resource Reinvested.

This is the vision and legacy that governs UC today. Each and every school year, UC has reinvested and continues to reinvest all its revenue and earnings back to UC operations.

As a consequence of the vision of UC's founders, UC is a school with no shareholders. It is a school that is able to conduct its business without being burdened by the pressure of shareholders. At the initiative of its founders, UC has been liberated from the obligation of serving the "bottom line."

Having statutorily relinquished ownership, the organizational energy and resources is thus devoted solely and fully to upgrading university standards. The intention was that --- this would lead to a path of excellence for the university's academic degree programs.

Having voluntarily relinquished ownership benefits, the fruit of corporate operations, thus, gravitates and inures, as a natural consequence, to the university constituency, i.e., the students, the faculty, the staff, the parents, the alumni and ultimately, to UC's home community, the city and region.

The management successors of the UC founders, while inheriting corporate control over the foundation, have been transformed from traditional shareholders to faithful stewards of UC's vision and legacy.

UC today strives to avoid acting like "an ivory tower"; isolated and oblivious to the concerns and conditions of its home community and region.
