## UC Offers Another Helping Hand

The University of the Cordilleras Publicity, Advertising and Communications Office (PACO) sponsored a three-day seminar-workshop for the residents of Aurora Hill from May 16 to 18 as part of the university's continuing effort to lend service and assistance to different communities in and around Baguio.

The three-day series of seminar-workshops were organized by UC to help the members of the Association of Barangay Councils of Aurora Hill (ABCAH) improve and develop their capabilities in running and maintaining a barangay.

The event began with a bang as College of Accountancy Dean Ramsay Colorado, together with faculty members Florendo Daus and Gerry Roxas gave lectures on Bookkeeping, aimed to acquaint the Aurora Hill residents on the ins and outs of establishing and maintaining a business.

College of Criminal Justice Education professor Atty. Renato Verdote highlighted the second day of the event with a lecture on "Parliamentary Procedure" to inform the participants about the fundamentals of the justice system. The practicing lawyer also elaborated on "Drugs Education" to educate the Aurora Hill residents about the effects of dangerous drugs. The first two days of the event were held at the Bayan Park Village Barangay Hall.

The final day featured the Internet Literacy Program, handled by Dr. Felipe Pati, Jr. of the College of Information and Computing Sciences. As part of the program, participants received hand-on training using UC's computer laboratory.

After the three-day seminar-workshop, participants expressed their approval and gratitude to the UC community, calling the event informative, helpful, and educational.

## CHAMP-OSY Continues to Change Lives: Sends 17 youths to College

Seventeen out-of-school youths will soon be given a chance to change their lives thanks to the University of the Cordilleras CHAMP-OSY (Coaching and Mentoring to Attain Maximum Performance for out-of-school youth) program launched last year by the university's Supreme Student Government (SSG).

The 17 young men and women consistently attended the CHAMP-OSY program, which offers free tutorial services and review sessions for the Accreditation and Equivalency exam of the Department of Education (DepEd). As a result, they will now have a chance to enter college and continue their education.

Former UC SSG president and CHAMP-OSY founder Labio Calingayan will personally assist the 17 CHAMP-OSY products in enrolling at UC to further help them in their quest for college education.

A former high school dropout who received a second shot at tertiary education by passing the Philippine Educational Placement Test, Calingayan was awarded as one of the Ten Accomplished Youths by Malacañang for his selflessness in lending service to his fellow youth. He has already helped ten out-of-school youths enter college and the former SSG president, fully aware of the importance of college education, is determined to help more out-of-school youths enter college.

## UC Turns Sports Ambassador; Holds Volleyball Clinic

The University of the Cordilleras proved that sports has a special place in its heart as it hosted a sports clinic and basic coaching training for volleyball at Guinzadan Central, Bauko Mountain Province.

With the victory, Docyogen is now the undisputed king of the URCC pinweight division, taking over Baga's reign, which lasted for four title defenses.
