

UC yields 33 new Civil Engineers

Civil Engineering at the University of the Cordilleras sustained its upscale swing in performance by yielding 33 new board passers in the November 18- 19, 2006 Civil Engineer Licensure Examinations.

Engr. Ireneo B. Panabang Panabang garnered an average of 96.5 rating and was declared 7th placer by the Professional Regulatory Commission (PRC). Engr. Panabang now occupies 144th slot in UC's legion of toppers from various licensure examinations.

Fresh from the May 2006 CE Licensure where four UC graduates garnered the 4th, 5th, 9th and 11th place, Dean Alec Mapalo of the College of Engineering and Architecture said the re-

cent November 2006 examinations with a 7th placer proved that UC's Engineering remains on top in licensure performance.

PRC record shows an improved passing rate performance of UC from 11.96% in November 2004; increasing to 21.00% in November 2005; it remarkably improved to 38.8% in May 2006; and now 39.00% for the November 2006 examinations.

shows 2nd place in 1960; 3rd place in 1963; 3rd place in 1970; and 4th place in 1994.

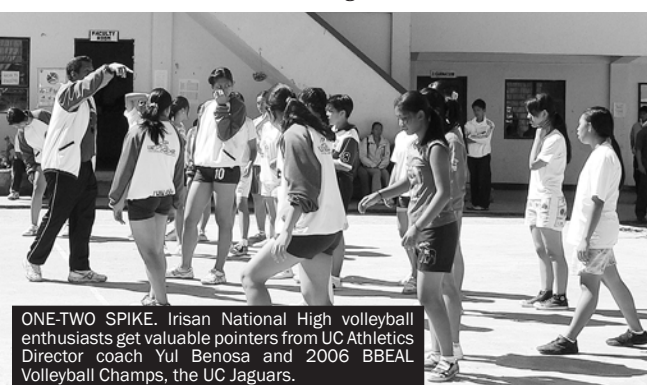
UC-CHRMT upheld "Culinary Champion of the North" tag

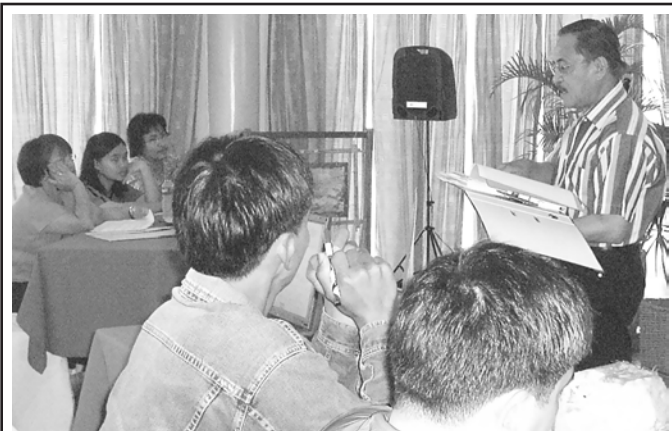

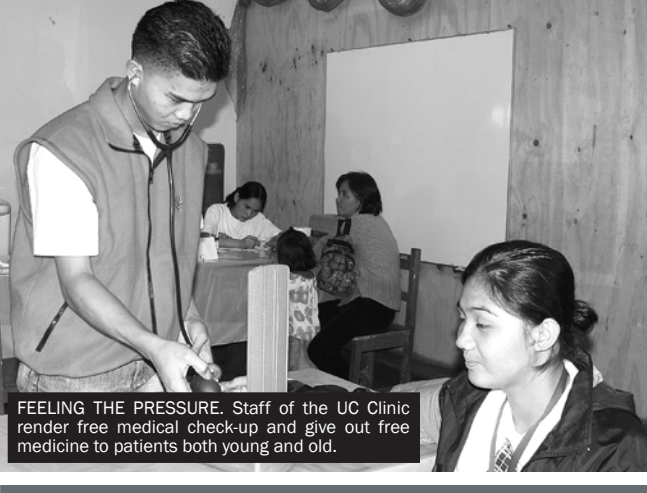

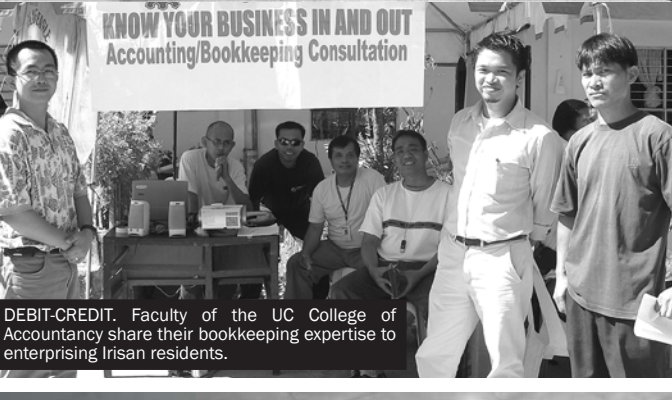
NO TEARS FORMULA. The UC Dental Staff work their magic as countless elementary and high school students line-up for tooth extraction.
