For several years in a row, the University of the for several years in a row, the University of the Cordineras formerly Baguio Colleges Foundation has been harvesting international medals for the country. Last week, Marianne Mariano, freshman of UC's College of Teacher Education, bagged the silver medal in the 56 kg category of the World Junior Wushu Championship held in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia last August 20-25, 2006.

Wushu junior ath-letes from 39 nations such as Asian Powerhouse China, Iran, Vi-etnam and other European countries were mesmerized by the skill of the petite 17 year old Marianne Mariano, a new member of the UC Wushu-Sanshu team Wushu-Sanshu team representing the Phil-ippines in the much awaited world champi-

onship. Мs. Mariano, despite her five foot height demonstrated mastery of the combat sport as she overpowered Vietnam ^{*} a 2-0 in best of three count during the quarterfi-nals. She went on to defeat Turkey again with a 2-0 score in the semifinals. However, the diminutive Baguio girl bowed for a silver from a 5'5"

tall Chinese player in the finals. Last the Mariano won the bronze during the ASEAN Wushu junior Championship held in Singapore.
